### West Silchar College at a glance :


West Silchar College is the one and only higher educational institution in a large area called West Silchar Area. It was established on 1<sup>ST</sup> January 1985 at the composite efforts of a few farsighted education loving people of West Silchar Locality . The College is purely an Arts Degree College located in a completely rural and peaceful area at Barjatrapur about 15 kms. away from Silchar Town of Cachar District. The College is affiliated to Assam University, Silchar. At present, the College offers ten subjects in Pass Course. The College introduces CBCS system from the academic session 2018-2019.

The College is registered under 2(f) of the UGC Act 1956 . It was Provincialized by the Government of Assam with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2013.

- To make the institution a hub of excellence of higher education for rural students of ethnic domain with a view to empower them to face and overcome the challenges in transforming the lives of the local masses.

- To spread quality higher education among the people of rural areas of the greater locality

- The institution is socially responsible to give admission to students with very poor academic result and they cannot be refused as they belong to locality.
- 100 percent computer literacy is not achieved among staffs.
- Lack of complete disabled friendly environment.

- Introduction of vocational courses and soft skills.
- Promotion of eco-friendly environment by utilizing the unused wetland (pond).
- Sufficient land for infrastructure development.
- To excel the students as well as local people in game and sports.
- To open science and commerce stream.

- Difficult to motivate the student to attend regular classes as most of them belong to poor economic background. They even cannot manage the transport fare to come to College regularly.
- Insufficient funds to meet the required development, accommodation facility and employment of required staff.
- Teaching staff is involved in non-academic duties by the government which hampers the regular classes of the students.

## **Part-B-Administrative Audit**

### **Administrative Set Up-**

West Silchar College was established on 1<sup>st</sup> January in the year 1985 and was Provincialized by the Govt. Assam in the year 2014 with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> January, 2013. The Governing Body of the College is the apex administering authority formed by the Govt. of Assam and Principal i/c of the College is the Member Secretary and DDO of the College. The College abides by the rules and regulations of the UGC, Director of Higher Education, State Government of Assam and its affiliating University. The College has a dynamic IQAC along with various Cells and Committees which are formed as per NAAC and UGC guidelines. All the Cells function their duties sincerely with co-ordination with the IQAC. Besides Students 'Union, Anti Ragging Cell, Women Cell, Anti Sexual Harassment Cell, NSS Unit, Career Counselling and Placement Cell etc. are working for the welfare of the students. There are also Academic Committee, Admission Committee, Examination Committee and Library Committee formed with Principal as Chairman.

Construction Committee of the College supervises the infrastructure development related activities with consultation with the Governing Body.

All financial transactions are made through Bank Accounts of the College and are audited by Chartered Accountant in every financial year. 8 numbers of Accounts are maintained for transactions of funds of the College in Assam Gramin Vikash Bank, Barjatrapur Branch, Cachar.

1. The College is the only higher educational institution located in the rural West Silchar area inhabited mainly by socio-economically backward SC,ST,OBC,MOBC and minority community people.
2. The College has a healthy enrolment of girl students and it always encourages them for higher education and works for women empowerment in this backward area.

4. The College has adopted two numbers of villages from the nearby locality and different activities are conducted there.
5. The College has its location at a peaceful, comfortable and silent zone and over all healthy atmosphere quite away from the humdrum of urban air.

5. Efforts should be made to organize FDP (faculty development programmed) and CBP (capacity building programme)
6. To organize training programme on computer literacy for teaching and non-teaching staffs.
7. Opening of Add on Certificate course.
8. Development of Wi-Fi connectivity for the entire College campus.
9. Emphasis should be given on purchasing of more sports materials as well as to organize collaborative activities such as sports, cultural program etc. with other institution.
10. Completion of College Auditorium.
11. Frequent meeting with alumni and other stakeholders.
12. Feedback should be collected from all stakeholders.
13. Regular practice of green audit, energy audit and other Academic activities.


