1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Institutional Profile: West Silchar College first started its journey in 1985 under Gauhati University. With the inception of Assam University in the year 1994, West Silchar College automatically came under the domain of Assam University in the year 1994. The pioneers of the College were the education loving people of greater West Silchar area who sowed the seed of this rural College. The College has an ideal location by the side of a 'Dighi' popularly known as 'Rani Dighi' and sprawled over 18 bighas of land donated by Laskar & Barlaskar families, in rural surroundings at Barjatrapur on the West Bank of the river Barak crossing the "Altaf Setu' on "Rani Induprobha Road" in the district of Cachar. The distance between the College and the Silchar city is about 15 Kms. Away from the humdrum of the busy city life of Silchar and set amidst rural but peaceful surroundings, the College engages itself in academic pursuits. West Silchar College is an Arts College. At present the College offers Three Year Degree Course under Assam University, Silchar. After a long journey of 27 years in venture stage, West Silchar College was Provincialised by the Govt of Assam on 20-01-2014 with effect from 01-01-2013. West Silchar College is now temporarily affiliated to Assam University. West Silchar College is registered under Societies Registration Act, 1860. It is also registered under Section 2(F) of the UGC Act, 1956. Efforts are on to bring the College under Section 12(B) of the UGC. The College is managed by a body of respectable personalities under the name and style "Governing Body" constituted by the Govt. under the provisions of Assam. The G.B. is committed to make all round development of the College. In spite of all such growth and development, West Silchar College is still on growing stage. It does not rest on complacency rather striving hard to attain the highest goal. Of course, such a goal can be attained only by the whole hearted co-operation, guidance and support from all corners. We do promise to go miles before we sleep.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

West Silchar College adheres to the basic methodology as regards curriculum delivery of the complete syllabus of the various programmes that are currently offered in College. The College has its well-timed, well-thought out and over all time -tested curriculum delivery process in an inbuilt system concerned with teaching-learning perspectives over a period of years. At the beginning of every academic year, the Academic Calendar and Class Routine are prepared by the Committees formed for the purpose. Before the commencement of classes of a semester, HoD and other faculty members of respective departments jointly arrange the distribution of syllabus with mutual understanding in respect of prescribed Paper, Unit and Topics of different subjects. HoDs of different departments keep an eye to whether the classes are duly conducted as per routine in view of the completion of syllabus of respective departments within the Semester. The HoDs also bring the matter of the entire arrangement of distribution of syllabus and class routine to the notice of the Principal comprehensive observation and supervision of classes. In the introductory classes, every teacher informs the students about syllabus and distribution of Units, Topics and general plan of lessons. Students are also made aware at the end of a class regarding the topic to be dealt with in the next class. Study materials are generally supplied to the students by every department in the form of hard and soft copies. Various methods ,such as, Chalk and talk, demonstrations, audio-visual presentation, project works, field visits etc. are used in the delivery process. Group discussions, students' seminar, MCQ Tests, Quiz, Debate etc. are also conducted from time to time. The College also conducts Class and Unit Tests regularly.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

West Silchar College adopts a number of teaching-learning methods, such as, Unit Test, Class Test, Project Work, Assignment, Group Discussion, Surprise Test, Students' Seminar, Classroom interaction to assess the level of students' learning and their involvement in teaching learning process and thereby helps them rid of their problems, difficulties and queries, if any. Slow learners are also identified in the right and justified ways and remedial classes are arranged by all the Departments to address and thus redress the problems of slow learners as discovered by the concerned teacher. In addition to academics, the students are also encouraged to participate in different co-curricular activities, such as, quiz, debate, sports and cultural programmes. The College takes interest to further the scope of participation of students in any event organized by the College, Affiliating University, other institutions and sometimes by District Administration as well as a measure to enhance their depth of knowledge, creativity and potential. The teachers of the College inspire the students to join workshops, seminars etc. conducted by the College as a part of participative learning.

The College follows the Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) process as per the newly introduced CBCS Course by the Affiliating University.

Continuous Internal Evaluation System in all Semester Courses of the College comprises Internal Assessment Tests/Unit Tests and Attendance in classes. Thus, under Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA), total marks are awarded to the students on the basis of marks obtained in the Unit Tests/Internal Assessment Tests and the percentage of Attendance in subject wise classes in accordance with CBCS guidelines of the University. This system of assessment is very helpful to guess the success and lapse of students. The College conducts the Internal Assessment Tests/ Unit Tests twice in a Semester with prior notification of its time as intimated by the Affiliating University. Before the Introduction of CBCS in the Session 2018-2019 Assessment of the students' performance was done by Internal Examinations and Class Tests etc.in accordance with the Non CBCS rules and regulations of the Affiliating University to support them for the Final Examinations of the University.

Research, Innovations and Extension

The teachers of West Silchar College undergo career advancement programmes from time to time to enhance their professional knowledge. The College management always encourages the facuty members to go for various Career Advancement Programmes along with research related activities. Attempts were made for few minor research activities. The College is however striving hard in pursuit of Research activities in various forms, such as, field trips and excursion. But to speak the truth, the College greatly realizes the need of major research-based projects and activities and is in line of implementation of the same. In respect of innovation, the College has its plan to promote services to the community along with service to the students and teachers. The College has also plans to make the people of the locality aware of the need of information regarding employment news and use of resources from possible sources for all round development of locality. Stress is also given on the local farmers to make the best use of natural and traditional raw materials and conserve the biodiversity for all the best of their professional, social and economic interest in the form of a balanced and sustainable environment.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

West Silchar College has 3 Halls, 7 Rooms, 1 Library Hall cum Reading Room,1 Room for IQAC,1 Faculty Room, 1 Girls'Common Room,1 Boys' Common Room, 1 Principal's Room, 2 Office Rooms,1 Store Room, 6 Toilets,1 Smart Classroom(under construction), 1 Women's Hostel(under construction) and 1 Auditorium(under construction). Efforts are on to have two Smart Class Rooms in the College. There are 7 functional Computer Sets available in the College. The College has also planned to establish one Central Library and one Central Computer Lab as early as possible with the availability of funds. The College has its Library with a reading room to serve the purpose of the students and the staff. There is one Librarian along with 3 other Library staff. Honestly and truly speaking, the Library needs to be updated in respect of collection of books, automation and provision of modern Library facilities. The College seriously views the lapse and need of the development of Library and has a keen interest to fulfill the end in view on top most priority. The College has Wi-Fi facility of Bharat Net for students, faculty and staff. The College also generally provides reading facility of two local dailies of vernacular language and one English daily. The College campus is under the 24 hours CC TV surveillance.

Student Support and Progression

West Silchar College was established with the motto of imparting higher education along with serving to the students of backward and downtrodden background dominated mainly by SC,OBC and Minority Communities. The College is committed to the attainment of its motto in the right direction. Naturally a College is an institution of the students, by the students and for the students and thus obviously various administrative, curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities are focused on the students. The College always encourages the students to participate in co-curricular activities to cultivate their skills and potentials. The Students' Union of the College rightly and sincerely considers and values this genuine need of the hours for the students' interest. Interested and intending students are always supported to further their participation in various programmes like debate, quiz, recitation, singing and acting, dancing and performing in the events of annual College festival and on other celebrations also. The College has a newly constituted NSS Cell to function towards its aims and objectives. On many occasions the students get to add pride and glory to the College. The College has a multi-lingual annually published magazine the "West Wind" to improve the writing skill and creative excellence of the students. They are always motivated, guided and supported by teaching and non-teaching staff to contribute more to the magazine. The College has planned to arrange to publish already edited Bengali Departmental Magazine 'Srijani' and take on the task of starting one Wall Magazine. The College has an Extension Activities Cell comprised of seven members for undertaking extension related activities for the development of the students and local community. Under the guidance of this Cell, three Excursion Trips were undertaken at Shillong, Rajasthan and Khaspur.

Governance, Leadership and Management

West Silchar College has an efficient system of governance giving emphasis on the concept of decentralized and participative nature of involvement for all concerned. The College has its perspective plan which is an indicator of effective leadership leading to and adding new milestones to the institution. In addition to the academic committees, different cells and committees are there with different assigned responsibilities to ensure true, vibrant and democratic governance in the College. Every member of the College family enjoys the right to share in the decision as well as policy making for the well being of the College and their views are considered and valued with due importance for the interest of the College.

The College has its short term, mid term and long term plans for its strategic development in a phased manner. There is a need of opening of Commerce and Science streams in the College. Accordingly, as a part of strategic development plan, a proposal for the introduction of Commerce Stream in the College has been forwarded to the Director of Higher Education, Assam for its consideration. 	about 15 Kms. distance from Silchar town of Cachar District in the State of Assam. So it is necessitated to introduce multidiscipline in the curriculum of the College. In view of the above, The College submitted proposal earlier to the DHE-Assam for introduction of Commerce Stream in the College. As a part of preparedness for NEP, the College has felt the need of opening Science Stream in the College and accordingly steps are being taken to arrange to forward proposal to the DHE-Assam in this regard. Further, the College has its interest and plan to introduce Vocational Courses so that students may opt for multidisciplinary/ Interdisciplinary programmes as laid in the New Education Policy-2020.
2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	As per the instructions of Assam University, Silchar, Students of the College have started opening of ABC Accounts and so far as records available in the College, nearly 70% students of the College have been registered with the ABC. Our target is to reach the hundred percent registration of students with ABC soon
3. Skill development:	West Silchar College is trying to introduce Vocational/Skill Development Courses that may make the students develop their skills. Talks are on with other Nodal Agencies to give necessary permission for opening such courses in the College to pave the way for the students to gather extra knowledge. Moreover, the College thinks for the timely avenues for the students by introducing soft skill development course, computer courses and other job oriented courses to increase employability among the students.
4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):	The teachers of the College make efforts to integrate the knowledge of the students in the subjects like Political Science, History, Economics and Sociology with Bengali, Arabic and Manipuri and also try to integrate different cultures of various communities living in the neighborhood of the College. The teachers slso understand the need of online course in this regard and try to make the best use of it.
5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):	Today seems to be the age of outcome based education in the context of the globalised scenario. And hence the College has no other option but to focus on the outcome based education of the students

	and gives topmost priority on it.
6. Distance education/online education:	Though there is no scope of Distance education in the College at the moment but the teachers always inspire the students to go for other distance/online courses in the various trustworthy Learning Portals like SWAYAM/NIOS/SOS. Mrs. Rini Begam Laskar, Asstt. Prof. is working as Co-ordinator in this area. Many students of our College have already successfully completed different courses from these learning Portals. Further, efforts are on to open a Study Centre of K. K. Handique State Open University, Guwahati at our College

issues affecting nature. Environmental Studies offered in our College gives the students knowledge, skill and analytical tools needed to tackle these environmental challenges on a local, regional and national level. The teaching-learning process is one major strength of our college. Students are given a right blend of traditional and modern methods to make learning student-centric and a rewarding experience. The college conducts various student centric activities throughout the year. Experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are well adopted to ensure the holistic development of students and facilitate life-long learning and knowledge management. Limited ICT tools available in the College are also used for the purpose.

Teaching-learning methods adopted by the faculty members include Lecture Method, Interactive Method, Project/Assignment based Learning, Experiential Learning etc. The Teaching-learning activities are made effective through illustration and special lectures

The conventional Lecture method is commonly adopted by all teachers. This method facilitates the teachers to interpret, explain and revise the content of a text-only for better understanding of the subject by the learners.

The College provides students an effective platform to develop the latest skills, knowledge, attitude, values to shape their behaviour in the right manner. The College conducts innovative programs which stimulate the creativity of students and provide them a platform to nurture their problem-solving skills and ensure participative learning. The College organizes co-curricular activities, extra-curricular activities, sports and Annual College Festival every year along with group discussion, class presentation, quiz competition, essay writing, debate, poster making etc. which help the students to develop their all-round personality. The College further encourages the students to cultivate their creativity and potential by writing articles in the College Magazine, "West Wind", other publications and Wall Papers.

The College organizes expert lectures on different topics like folk culture, impact of tobacco to add vibrancy to the teaching process and experiential learning.

Field study and excursions are also an integral part of the learning methodology of our institution. Group of students under supervision of teachers are allowed for excursion to places like Shillong, Rajasthan and Khaspur. Such tours give them exposure to the outside world situation leading to augmentation of their skill and hands on knowledge.

Different extension activities like Blood Donation Camps, Flood Relief Camps, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan , Run for Fit India, Run for Unity, Awareness move on different issues etc. are organized by the College and these benefit the students in the development of their management skill and sense of respect for others. Different programmes are celebrated in the College to arouse patriotic and social values among students

Integration of ICT tools complements the traditional teaching-learning methods and assists the teachers to the requirements of today's globalized world. The College has ICT enabled tools like Desktop, Laptop Computers and has Wifi enabled campus etc. Some teachers use computer-based materials for better understanding of the students. During COVID-19 Pandemic, the teaching process continued through Smart Phones, Google meet and WhatsApp group. 2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1

Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

The College always follows the guidelines and rules of the Internal/External Examinations of Assam University, Silchar. The College has a well organized and transparent mechanism for redressal of examination related grievances.

At the beginning of every semester, all faculty members make students aware of the mechanism of Internal and External Assessment. The students are also sensitized to evaluation process of Internal and External Assessments. Internal examination test schedules are prepared and communicated to students in advance. For proper conduction of tests, minimum one invigilator is assigned for every 25 students and evaluation of answer sheets is done by concerned faculty members of the subjects within five working days. Evaluated answer sheets are shown to the respective students in their classroom by the concerned teacher. Grievances, if any, in connection with Internal Examinations are cleared accordingly with importance. Rules of entry and exit in exam hall are strictly obeyed in the College. Final Sessional marks and percentage of students' attendance are uploaded to the University portal as per the schedule

intimated by the University. Measures are generally taken to identify the slow learners, remedial classes are arranged for them and accordingly feedback is obtained to give necessary suggestions to such students by the faculty members for improvement.

The queries related to results, corrections in mark sheets and certificates, if any, of the students are duly forwarded by the College to the Exam. Section of the University for the needful. Aspiring students are allowed to apply for scrutiny/re-evaluation of Answer Scripts and such cases are forwarded to the University in a lot for the Non -CBCS Course. However, the students of CBCS Course apply online in the portal of the University for scrutiny/re -evaluation of their Answer Scripts. After the declaration of results and the process of re-evaluation generally continues for about a month. Concerned students can avail this facility with necessary fees as fixed by the University from time to time. This whole process is conducted in such a way so that the students get updated result within the next corresponding Semester.

Teachers of various Departments of the College also attend different curriculum related meetings, workshops, seminars organized by Assam University and other institutions from time to time. Thereafter these teachers take necessary initiatives departmentally to aware the other teachers about alterations, modifications etc., if any, made in the curriculum along with programme and course outcomes. Apart from this, Teachers also participate in various Refresher Course, Orientation Programme, Short Term Course etc. from time to time through which they enrich themselves with additional information regarding programme and course outcomes in their concerned subjects.

The College follows the rules and regulations of the Assam University, Silchar in the process of evaluation in different subjects. The institution has also an Internal Examination Committee to deal with effective implementation of the evaluation reforms regarding the attainment of course and programme outcomes. The College adopts tests and examinations to measure the attainment of programme specific

and course outcomes. Unit Tests and End Semester Theory Examinations are conducted as per the schedule framed by the Affiliating University.

Besides the aforesaid methods, the College also facilitates accessibility of teachers, assignments and class participation of students to enhance their progress. The class room lectures, assignments, and library facility also help the students to clarify their doubts and to perform well in examinations. Students are encouraged for the creativity in literature in the form of writing articles, poems and essays etc. for the College Annual Magazine and Annual College Festival held every year.

The evaluated answer scripts of different internal examinations are shown to the students in the classes and shortcomings are explained to individual student so that they can overcome their weaknesses in writing of answers. They are also suggested to augment their learning outcomes through the path way of specific Action Plans in the light of the shortcomings. Apart from academics, some students also perform well in Co-curricular and Extra-curricular activities both in Intra and Inter College Level for which they are awarded Certificates of appreciation along with Prizes.

West Silchar College is a growing rural College established in a backward set up inhabited by marginalized sections of the society. It has been establishing its infrastructure and physical facilities with its limited sources, resources and capacities. At the moment, West Silchar College has 3 Halls, 7 Rooms, 1 Library Hall cum Reading Room, 1 Room for IQAC, 1 Faculty Room, 1 Girls 'Common Room, 1 Boys Common Room, 1 Principal' Room, 2 Office Rooms, 1 Store Room, 6 Toilets, 1 Smart Classroom (under construction), 1 Women's Hostel(under construction) and 1 Auditorium(under construction). Efforts are on to have two Smart Class Rooms in the College. There are 7 functional Computer Sets available in the College. The College has also planned to establish one Central Library and one Central Computer Lab as early as possible with the availability of funds. The College has its Library with a reading room to serve the purpose of the students and the staff. There is one Librarian along with 3 other Library staff. Honestly and truly speaking, the Library needs to be updated in respect of collection of books, automation and provision of modern Library facilities. The College seriously views the lapse and need of the development of Library and has a keen interest to fulfill the end in view on top most priority. The College has Wi-Fi facility of Bharat Net for students and staff. The College also generally provides reading facility of two local dailies of vernacular language and one English daily. The College campus is under the 24 hours CC TV surveillance. However, the College feels the urgent need of necessary increase in infrastructure facilities to meet and face the timely challenges and requirements with the changing educational scenario.

Response:

West Silchar College has a Library with a reasonable collection of Text and Reference Books of different departments. At the moment, the College Library is not an automated one. And, presently the Library doesn't have Integrated Library Management System. Nevertheless, sincere efforts are on to get the Library with the provision of integrated Library Management System (ILMS). The College has been running amidst financial crisis and hardships. The College intends to get the College library automated as soon as the crisis will be over at the realisation of the reimbursement against fee waiver scheme from the Govt.

The College generally purchases books on the basis of the departmental requirements and in consideration of the availability of funds. There is a reading room attached with the Library to serve the purpose of the students and the staff. There is one Librarian along with 3 other Library staff. Honestly and truly speaking, the College Library needs to be updated in respect of collection of books, automation and provision of modern Library facilities. The College has not yet received any fund from any agency or Govt. for the development of the Library. In the Session 2017-2018 to 2021-2022 an amount of Rs. 179045/- was spent on purchase of books and Rs.229900/- on publication of "West Wind", Magazine of the College and Rs.20561/- on purchase of 'Dainik Samayik Prasanga', a local daily. We have planned to purchase some books in different subjects as early as possible to develop the Library, activate Library Automation and also to start subscription to e- resources as well as journals.

4.3 IT Infrastructure

- **1. Title of the Practice:** Organization of Flood Relief Camp for the flood victims of the neighbouring villages.
- 2. Objectives of the Practice: The main idea behind setting up flood relief camp in the College was to stand by the helpless and needy people of the adjacent areas affected by devastating flood. Every flood leaves the affected region helpless impacting the property and lives of people. It is imperative for us to reach out to such flood affected people. Food, relief materials, shelter and trauma-relief workshops are essential needs for the flood victims. The aim of the camp was to provide all such minimum necessities to the flood affected people. The camp further focused on uniting various stakeholders to join hands in working for the flood relief including different NGO's for greater and frequent supply of relief materials during the period of critical situation. As an attempt to prevent the local people from being the victims of such a catastrophic fatal flood, our trained and committed team of staff and students had been relentless in their efforts to manage the flood camp in the College by distributing the relief materials to the victims sheltered in the camp from their flood affected homes even in the midst of having no transportation

facilities during flood.

3. The Context: The context of the flood relief camp held in our College arose out of the most devastating and life threatening flood in the months of June-July, 2022 ever might have been in Barak Valley from time immemorial. Considering the deplorable conditions of the neighbouring villages, our College came to realize the urgency of the situation and planned to hold a flood relief camp in collaboration with the District Administration of Cachar. The District Administration provided all necessary support, guidance, co-operation and assistance to our College. This was the context in view of setting up the West Silchar College Flood Relief Camp.

4. Practice:

- a) Making necessary arrangement of shelter for the flood victims.
- b) Arrangement of necessary relief materials for the victims.
- c) Construction of temporary extra toilets.
- d) Maintenance of cleanliness in the campus.
- e) Maintenance of Register and preparation of APR.
- f) Arrangement of pure drinking water.
- g) Arrangement of medical camp.

5. Evidence of Success:

- 1. The flood victims got shelter while their homes were inundated by flood.
- 2. They got food materials during flood.
- 3. They were provided with other minimum necessities.
- 4. Female victims were given extra care.
- 5. Children sheltered in the camp were taken care of seriously.
- 6. Local leading citizens and administration appreciated the initiative of our College in time of human lives in crisis.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:
